Advocate for the Profession and Practice of Social Work Contacting and Speaking with your Legislator

Step 1

Find your state legislator at - https://openstates.org

Step 2

Schedule a meeting

- It is best to make an appointment with your Representative and/or Senator **PRIOR** to Advocacy Day
- If you didn't make an appointment stop by their office and request a meeting during your visit at the State Capitol

Step 3

The process of asking for an appointment

"Hello, my name is _____ and I live in Senator or Representative's _____ district. I will be coming to Capitol for the Social Work Advocacy Day. I would like to make an appointment in the afternoon for around 10 minutes to discuss issues that are important to social workers.

GIVE THEM YOUR CELL PHONE NUMBER AS THEY MAY NEED TO RESET THE MEETING

Step 4

Getting into the State Capitol

• **Entrance to Capitol:** There is only one entrance to the State Capitol and that is the Visitors Entrance on the North Side which is the 8th street side – (SW 8th and SW Van Buren)

Step 5

What if they cannot meet?

- Ask the legislators' secretary to call you in case their schedule opens on that afternoon.
- Go to their office on that day and ask if any openings have come up for a meeting

Step 6

What do I talk about?

- Tell your story, your situation, and why social workers are important in your field of practice (i.e. child welfare, schools, mental health, health care, aging, veterans, etc.)
- Ask for them to support the practice of social work and incorporate your experience working in an agency setting through a practicum, or as a volunteer, or as a professional social worker.
- Leave a hand-written message and your contact information.

Step 7

Follow up and after action.

- If a Legislator asks for further information, it is fine to say that you don't have it and that you will get back to them at a later date.
- Write a thank you note to your legislator after the meeting.
